

ORDINANCE NO. 83-9

AN ORDINANCE OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA,
AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF ORDINANCE NO.
76-3 WHICH PROHIBITS THE PUMPING, TRANSPORT-
ING OR MOVING IN ANY MANNER WHATSOEVER, WATER
IN BULK QUANTITIES FROM HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE HERNANDO COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 3 of Hernando County Ordinance No.
76-3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

No person, firm corporation, county, (except for Hernando
County), municipality, or any other Governmental agency shall pump,
transport or move, in any manner whatsoever, including but not limited
to piping or pipelines, water in bulk quantities from the territorial
limits of Hernando County, Florida, to any other places within or
without the State of Florida for domestic, commercial and/or Govern-
mental use.

In order to further implement this section, the sinking or
drilling of deep wells or large wells is hereby prohibited, notwith-
standing any permits which might be issued by the Southwest Florida
Water Management District, or any other Governmental agency unless and
until a special permit is obtained from the Hernando County Board of
County Commissioners, and the Board shall have the right to establish
reasonable rules, regulations and fees in connection with such special
permits.

SECTION 2. Section 5 of Hernando County Ordinance No. 76-3
is hereby amended to read as follows:

This Ordinance shall not apply to Hernando County, to the
State of Florida or to the United States of America, except for the
payment through condemnation, or otherwise, to Hernando County,
Florida, for the "property rights" described in Section 4.

This Ordinance shall specifically apply to any municipality
and/or County within the State of Florida, and to any other Govern-
mental agency outside of the State of Florida, with the Exception of
the United States of America and Hernando County. Hernando County
is especially exempted from the application of this ordinance inas-
much as it has created a County wide, Water and Sewer District
wherein it has determined that Hernando County is to be the exclusive
supplier of water within Hernando County for all prospective users
and uses.

SECTION 3. Adopted as an emergency ordinance pursuant to F.S. 125 by a vote of four (4) of five (5) County Commissioners voting. The emergency adoption is based upon the finding of the Board of County Commissioners that the health of residents of Aripeka, Florida, is immensely threatened by a contaminated water supply.
