AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 13, FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION, BY AMENDING SECTION 13-5, ITEM 22, ADDING TO THE DEFINITION OF A MOBILE HOME OR A MANUFACTURED HOME; AMENDING CHAPTER 13, BY CREATING ITEM 13-60(8) PROVIDING FOR PROTECTION OF ELECTRICAL, HEATING, VENTILATION, PLUMBING, AIR CONDITIONING EQUIPMENT, AND OTHER SERVICE FACILITIES; PROVIDING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Hernando County is in eminent danger of losing the Federal Flood Insurance Program which protects the health, safety, and welfare of the general populace located in areas of periodic flooding in Hernando County; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary for Hernando County to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Hernando County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 13, Section 13-5, Item 22, "Mobile Home or Manufactured Home" is hereby amended to add the following sentence:

"For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term mobile home includes manufactured home".

SECTION 2. Hernando County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 13, Section 13-60, Item 8 is hereby created to read:

"8. All electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, air conditioning equipment, and other service facilities shall be designed to prevent water entry or accumulation."


SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance, for any reason, is held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

ADOPTED in Regular Session of the Hernando County Board of County Commissioners on this 18th day of October, 1988,

A.D., as an emergency Ordinance with 5 affirmative votes of members of the Hernando County Board of County Commissioners.
